



#### 2. Lehi Has a Vision

And you know what? God did rescue us! When you ask him something, and have faith that he will do it - he will bless you. The storm



# 7. King Benjamin Teaches Charity

King Benjamin has been working hard to establish peace in the land. He's taught us many things. you: And now, if you believe all these things, see that ye do them (Mosiah 2:13–17 [LDS 4:9–10]).

So he was basically saying — believe in God. Believe that he is in charge and he knows about everything that's going on. Repent when you do things wrong, and pray that he will forgive you. And now that you know these things, live righteously.


Well, it looks like we're getting ready to head out again! I can't wait to see what God will do next! Take care and I'll talk with you again soon.

thought I was worth it. Jesus, my best friend, saved my life when he decided to come to earth. And now—he's here! His birth is my salvation—my hope.


And that's when I remember, God IS good and HE IS in



Jesus confirmed what we've always known: that he is the only way to inherit the kingdom of God. Because of

his sacrifice, because he was willing to do what he did, we are saved. I, Beezrom, can enter into the kingdom of God because Jesus paid the price for me. It's so hard to understand that someone could love me that much... I mean, who do you know that would do such an amazing thing? Who would give up so much for someone else?

He reminded us that it's not good to be angry with others and that being angry can really hurt us. God wants us to be happy and joyful. He said, "For every one that asketh, receiveth; and he that seeketh, findeth; and to him that knocketh, it shall be opened." Do you know what that means?! That means that when we talk to God, he listens. Every time. All the time. When we

seek him, He's waiting for us. He longs for us to talk with him—to spend time in prayer, telling him our joys and concerns. Can you believe the creator of the universe actually wants to talk to us? That he actually waits, hoping we'll seek him? Wow! When I heard that,

I felt so important and loved.

By this time, I was so full of thoughts I kind of got lost in my mind thinking about all I'd learned until I noticed people moving around me. I looked up

and saw people who were hurting make their way toward Jesus. Some were blind and some couldn't walk very well, but others were helping them as they moved toward him. And then I realized what was happening: Jesus was healing them! One touch and they were healed! These people were whole again and praising his name. I was filled with awe. You don't have to be Moses or Lehi for God to want to talk with you—he's just as excited to talk with you as he was to talk with them. And that's the most important thing to remember: he wants to hear from you.

You'll never be able to bring others to Christ until you've brought yourself to him. Have you done that? Really? Have you ever stopped for a moment and

thought about what Jesus did for you and what that action means? You are spiritually alive only because Jesus died. For you. Because he loves you that much. So what should you do? You need to tell him thank you. You need to live your life to make him happy—to make his sacrifice valuable. How would you feel if you gave your friend one of your favorite toys but he never played with it? Wouldn't you be sad? Wouldn't you wish that he had understood



Where there is no darkness. And then we will see him and talk with him and hold his hand. Forever. Just like the Brother of Jared did.



I can't believe he loves us so much: we definitely don't deserve it. Last time we were talking about the bad things that happened to the Jaredites when they quit listening to God and following his plan. Isn't it interesting that people, who know Jesus is really great and have been blessed by God, so often forget to live like they should?

I've been thinking about that quite a bit lately: the idea that it seems like we keep making the same mistakes over and over when we should really know better. I've been thinking about myself a lot as well since we talked last. It's so easy to talk about everyone else and what they're doing wrong, but it's hard to admit that I might be doing the same thing myself. I think that's why we all keep getting in trouble and losing our way. We don't take the time to make sure we're really doing what we should.

Too often I find myself thinking about David and Abraham and Moses and the Jaredites and everyone who's goofed up, congratulating myself on not being as bad as them, when really I am just as bad. And even though these people didn't always do the right things, they all had amazing relationships with God because they kept trying—even after they messed up. I could learn a lot from them in that way.

I spend a lot of time hiding from God after I goof up, not believing he could really love me or forgive me if he knew what I did. But He's God! He already knows! He's seen it all and just wants me to come and talk with him about it. And if I would do that, I would be just like David and Abraham and Moses and everyone else—in the way that really matters: because I'd be forgiven. And that's the only thing that is worth anything.

I just wanted to remind you of those things. So, remember, next time you mess up (because we all do), go talk to God about it. Don't hide. Trust that he loves you and will forgive you. Remind yourself that the






